

Sample Certificate Program in Human Lactation

This is one example of a certificate program. Each educational institution and regional authority has their own process for designating credit hours, pre-requisites, course sequencing, and expectations. General Education course examples fulfill the IBLCE requirements for general education and continuing education topics. This example uses a standard numbering system for a 16-week semester. Some institutions will operate on quarters and some may count only 15 weeks, so it depends on the standard used by that state or region. In this example, 1 hour of lecture per week reflects 16 classroom hours and awards 1 credit. This example identifies how competencies in the *Curriculum for a Program in Human Lactation* (available on the LEAARC website) can fit into a 1-year certificate program along with the possible number of didactic and clinical hours for each area.
